Dip into a dictionary

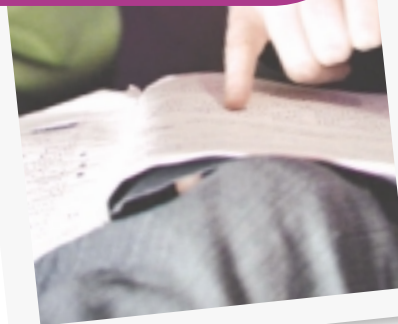
Keep the dictionary handy!

Put learning into practice

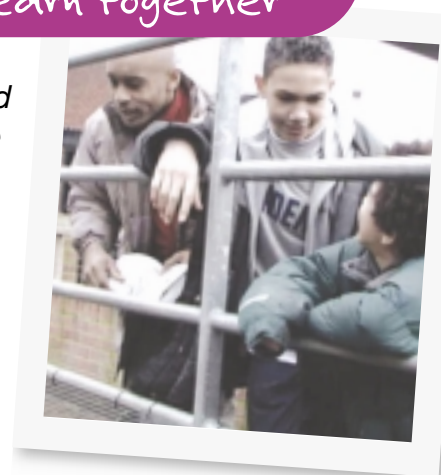
Get your child to:
